Learning Objectives

Our aim at Basil Paterson Edinburgh is to provide a learning environment which helps all students to reach their full potential. Whether your objective is to improve your English skills for work, university or life in an English-speaking country, you'll find that studying at Basil Paterson provides the focus and drive that you need. With a class maximum of 12 students from all over the world, you have the opportunity to interact in a truly international environment. Tailored support from experienced teachers, weekly assessments and individual coaching sessions help our learners to achieve their aims. Our methodology ensures that learners are not only developing their language range and accuracy, but also developing essential skills such as critical thinking, public speaking, self-study methods and compensation strategies. We expect learners on our adult courses to take ownership of the learning process, working with their teachers towards a common goal.

Course level

We ask every student to complete a needs analysis and placement test before arrival and a short speaking assessment on the first day. This gives us essential information about your English language level, your goals, your needs and which class would be most suitable for you. Students move at different speeds and there is no fixed time for studying at each level. Progress depends on motivation, self-study habits, learning strategies and language immersion. We expect students to work hard and focus on their goals, but also to be realistic about what is achievable in the time they have.

Assessment

Learners have a weekly assessment every Friday morning. This is designed to assess your progress, help you revise what you have studied and push you to apply new language and skills. Your teachers will assess your progress in class all the time, by reading your written work, listening to your spoken production and evaluating your performance in class. They will give you regular feedback and discuss your progress during weekly coaching sessions. Students are also expected to self-assess regularly, evaluating their own progress in relation to their goals.

Coaching

Every Friday learners are invited for an individual coaching session. The purpose of these sessions is to provide an opportunity to discuss your own progress and to set achievable goals for selfstudy. We expect all learners to take responsibility for their own learning and work hard outside of class time. Think about what you want and need to improve most and how you can do this independently. Make sure your objectives are SMART (specific, measurable, achievable, relevant and time-bound).

Academic Approach

Homework

Our courses are designed to be intensive and learners should expect homework every night and over the weekend. Doing self-study regularly will ensure you make better progress and develop good learning habits. Remember that homework doesn't need to be a written exercise. Why not challenge yourself to make a phone call to a company in English, interview your homestay hosts or watch a TED Talk on an interesting topic?

Certificates

At the end of your course, you will be given a certificate showing your course dates, attendance and assessment of your level of spoken production, spoken interaction, reading, listening and writing skills. The levels are based on your teachers' evaluation of your level with reference to the Common European Framework for Languages.

Daily Programme

The day of study starts with a morning discussion session, bringing students from all classes together. Interesting topics are selected from local and international news as a springboard for discussion. The rest of the day consists of carefully designed lessons which cater for your diverse needs.

Spoken Performance Workshop

With a focus on pronunciation and using roleplays, presentations and discussions, learners develop their oral fluency, enabling them to operate confidently in a variety of real-life situations in English.

Language Focus

Authentic target language and grammar points are introduced in this session, helping learners develop a solid foundation in English language.

Language Practice

Building upon the language introduced in the previous class, learners have the opportunity to put their new knowledge into practice through speaking and writing activities.

Reading and Writing Skills Focus

This class provides intensive focus on improving your reading and writing skills, as needed for your future work or studies.

Project Workshop

This class mirrors the project work and collaboration which takes place in English around the world every day. In addition to your English language skills, you also develop your problemsolving, interpersonal, research and organisational skills.

Christmas Course

Festival Course

In August every year, Edinburgh comes alive for the International and Fringe festivals, with thousands of performances taking place in venues across the city, including dance, theatre, comedy and the world-famous Edinburgh Military Tattoo. We harness this energy in the classroom with our Festival course, which runs from 5th to 23rd August. The course structure mirrors the English Focus programme, combining essential language and skills development and an afternoon Project Workshop inspired by the Edinburgh Festival. On past courses students have prepared and delivered a performance, led their own guided tour and produced a festival documentary, demonstrating their new-found confidence in a second language. The course is complemented by a full and varied social and cultural programme, with eight activities scheduled per week.

The Festival Course is particularly suited to those interested in literature and performance art, providing a fully immersive cultural experience. Where possible we recommend students book for the full three-week programme so they have the opportunity to see all the festival has to offer.

We want your experience in Edinburgh to be as enjoyable as possible and for that reason we offer a wide choice of accommodation options. Whether you prefer an immersed experience in a homestay or require more independence, our dedicated accommodation staff will help you find the right option.

Homestay £225 per week (shared bathroom) or £345 per week (private bathroom)

Living in a homestay has many advantages. Most importantly, you have the chance to practise English throughout your stay, to interact with local people and to immerse yourself in the local culture and language. We choose our homestay families very carefully, both for the facilities they have to offer and, especially, their ability to give you the warmth and welcome of a "home from home". At your homestay you will eat meals with the other members of the household and share the common living areas. You are provided with a single room, or shared room if required, breakfast and dinner every day and a quiet place for study. Homestays are located in residential areas of Edinburgh, typically 30-40 minutes from the college on good bus routes.

Student residence (July/Aug)

During summer months we can offer several different university residence options; ideal for students aged over 18 who would like a more independent living experience. At a student residence you will have a single room with private bathroom, access to shared kitchen facilities and common living areas. Most residence options are within walking distance from the college. Please note that demand for student residence accommodation is high during the summer months, so we recommend booking as early as possible to avoid disappointment.

Private apartments

These are available throughout the year and range from studios to multi-bedroom flats. We work closely with several reputable letting agencies who offer accommodation in central Edinburgh. Please contact us with your travel dates to confirm availability and price.

At Basil Paterson Edinburgh we believe the learning experience should continue once classes have finished for the day. Our courses run alongside a varied social and cultural programme, which provide an opportunity for students to learn about the Scottish capital and make friends with both international and local students in a relaxed and informal setting. During the summer months we offer eight weekday activities per week and at least four activities per week during the rest of the year. The schedule changes every week, designed to provide something for all ages and interests. The majority of our activities are free of charge, with a small supplement for certain activities such as theatre visits or Scottish ceilidh dancing. We can also help students to book weekend trips to other parts of Scotland and make recommendations about the best places to visit.

2. Scottish Ceilidh Dancing

At a traditional Scottish ceilidh, you won't just be a spectator; you'll be a participant. Scottish dancing is fun, energetic, sociable and all ceilidhs have a 'caller'; someone who teaches you the dance steps.

3. Escape Room

Working with a team of your classmates, you'll use your critical thinking and problemsolving skills to escape from a room. Will you manage to escape before your time is up?

4. Visit to the Scottish Parliament

Learn more about this historic and controversial building and go inside the debating chamber to listen to live debates.

5. Walk up Arthur's Seat

Did you know that Edinburgh is built around seven hills? A short walk to the top of Arthur's Seat provides beautiful views of the city skyline.



Getting here

You can fly directly to Edinburgh from over 100 destinations worldwide. The city is just a 1 hour flight from London and is also well connected to other major UK cities by train.

Airport arrivals

Edinburgh International Airport is only 7 miles from the city centre, with the journey taking just 25 minutes. There are a number of regular transport services to the city centre:


- Airlink bus service Operates every 10 minutes during the day and every half hour at night. A return ticket will cost around £7.50. You will find the bus stop just outside the airport terminal.
- Tram A new and popular method to travel to the city centre. Trams every 10 minutes each way, taking 40 minutes to arrive centrally at Princes Street. Return tickets £8.50.
- Taxi hire Taxis are available from directly outside the airport terminal. A single journey to the city centre will cost around £30.
- Executive airport transfer Basil Paterson can organise a transfer directly from Edinburgh airport to your accommodation. This will cost £58 each way, per person.

Public transport

The city is further connected with an excellent public transport system.

Public transport available in Edinburgh:

- Buses Connecting the city and its outskirts with a vast network of routes. Lothian buses sell weekly and monthly tickets which offer unlimited travel.
- Trains The two main train stations, Waverley and Haymarket, link Edinburgh to cities and towns across the UK.
- Taxis There are taxi ranks located throughout the city. A typical short journey should cost approximately £7 to £10.

Terms: the terms and conditions set out below;

1.2 When We use the words "writing" or "written" in these Terms, this includes e-mail unless We say otherwise.

Bookings 2

- 2.1 Bookings can be made by completing and submitting the form on Our website together with payment of your Deposit or the total Fees (as applicable, see clause 3.1).
- 2.2 Please ensure that you read these Terms carefully, and check that the details of your Booking are complete and accurate, before you make your Booking.
