# Why Do NZCEL?

- NZCEL programmes will prepare you to study English in an academic context.
- · You will graduate with the language skills required to communicate independently and effectively in every situation with fluency and flexibility in academic settings.

- NZCEL L3 is at a level comparable to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) Low B2 (i.e. IELTS 5.5).
- NZCEL L4 is at a level comparable to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) Mid B2 (i.e. IELTS 6.0).
- NZCEL L5 is at a level comparable to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) High B2 level (i.e. IELTS 6.5).



# What You Will Learn?

Graduates of this qualification will be able to:

- · Understand the main ideas and supporting details of moderately complex oral academic texts.
- Participate effectively in sustained spoken academic discourse.
- · Understand the main ideas and supporting details of moderately complex written academic texts.
- Write detailed, developed and moderately complex academic texts.



# **NZCEL Programmes Structure**

- NZCEL Levels 3, 4 & 5 are a 16-week course.
- · There are two parts, parts A and B.
- · Part A focuses on developing skills and is course bookbased. Students are assessed internally.
- Part B is topic-based and focuses on applying skills in authentic contexts. Level 3 and Level 4 are assessed with NZQA Unit Standards.







NZCEL programmes consist of approximately 600 hours of study (total student effort), which corresponds to a 60 credit value of the qualification

## **Entry Requirements**

International students must meet the following requirements:



### NZCEL Level 3 Applied (academic)

- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Produce evidence of proficiency in English equivalent to a Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR)
  High B1. This may be demonstrated via a recognised
  English language testing system such as IELTS, PTE, or achievement in the NZCEL L2.
- Possess the appropriate student visa.



### **NZCEL Level 5 Academic**

- · Be at least 16 years of age.
- Produce evidence of proficiency in English equivalent to a Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR)
  Mid B2. This may be demonstrated via a recognised
  English language testing system such as IELTS, PTE, or achievement in the NZCEL L4.
- · Possess the appropriate student visa.

### **NZCEL Level 4 Academic**

- · Be at least 16 years of age.
- Produce evidence of proficiency in English equivalent to a Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) Low B2. This may be demonstrated via a recognised English language testing system such as IELTS, PTE, or achievement in the NZCEL L3.
- Possess the appropriate student visa.

Where a prospective student for the NZCEL L3, L4 or L5 programmes cannot produce evidence of current English proficiency, Bridge will use its own Internal English Proficiency Test (IEPT) to assess and determine the student's entry-level.

# **Education Pathways**

NZCEL Level 3 can lead to:

- NZCEL Level 4 Academic.
- This certificate facilitates meeting the language requirements for some vocational training courses.

NZCEL Level 4 can lead to:

- · NZCEL Level 5 Academic.
- This certificate facilitates meeting the language requirements for undergraduate studies at most New Zealand Universities.

NZCEL Level 5 can lead to:

- Meeting the language requirements for degrees that are linguistically demanding and/or in a specialised field of study.
- · Most postgraduate degrees.
